

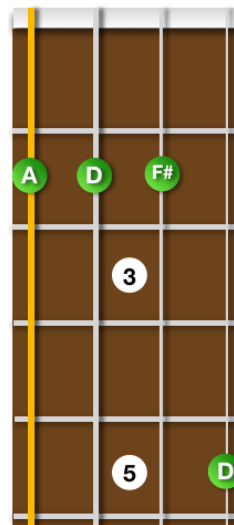
Chord structure (2)

Major chords are triads made up from 3 notes in the order 1 3 5.

Example: the chord of D Major is **D**, **F#** and **A**.

F G A B C **1** D E **3** F G **5** A B C D E F G A B C

The key of D contains 2 sharps (#) on F and C, therefore you play F# rather than the F.



The basic D Major chord can also be played by fretting the 1st string, fifth fret (D).

Another way of playing D Major is with a C Major shape but on the 5th fret. Again, all the notes are **D**, **F#** or **A**.
