
Chord structure (2)


Major chords are triads made up from 3 notes in the order ${\bf 1}$ ${\bf 3}$ ${\bf 5}$.

Example: the chord of D Major is D, F# and A.

1 3 5 FGABCDEFGABCDEFGABC

The key of D contains 2 sharps (#) on F and C, therefore you play F# rather the F.





The basic D
Major chord can
also be played
by fretting the
1st string,
fifth fret (D).

Another way of playing D
Major is with a C Major shape but on the 5th fret.
Again, all the notes are D,
F# or A.
