

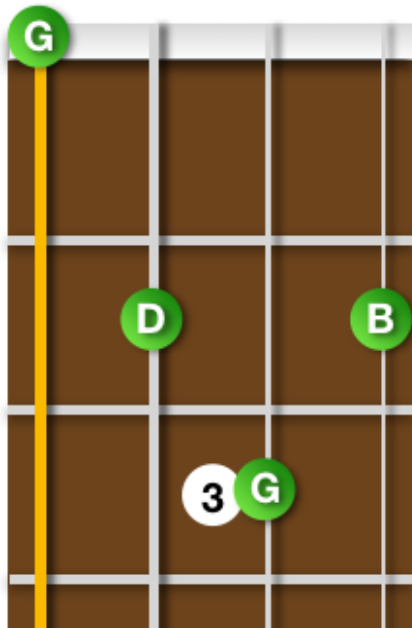
Chord structure (4)

Seventh chords are Major triads (1, 3, 5) with an added 7th. (Strictly speaking, it's a flattened 7th.) Because it has a note added to the triad, it is known as an **extension chord**.

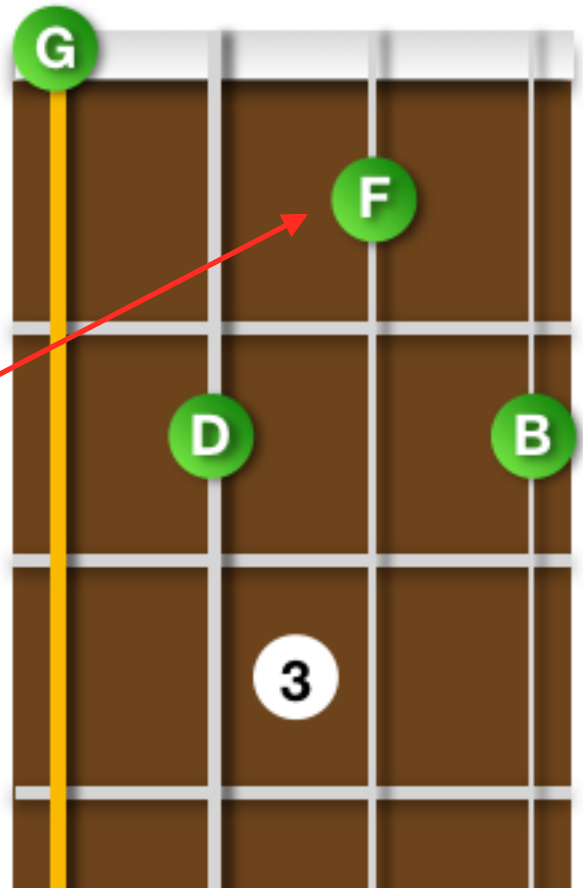
Example: the chord of **G seventh (G7)**.

The chord of G Major is...

F G A B C D E F ¹G ³A ⁵B C ⁷D E F G A B C



Therefore **G Major** is **G**, **B** and **D**.



The 7th note from G is F and the most obvious way to add this note is to play the first fret on the 2nd string.
