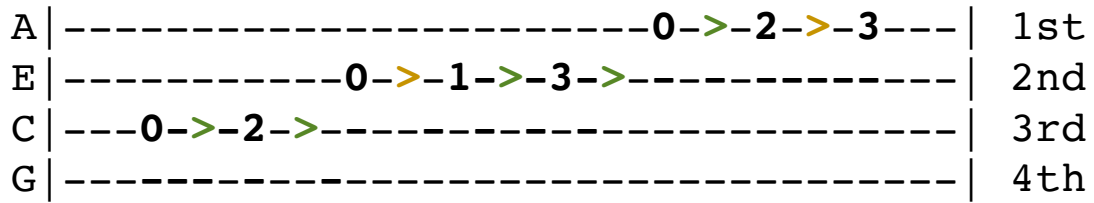


Diatonic scale of C (Ukulele)



Note	C	D	E	F	G	A	B	C
Finger	0	2	0	1	3	0	2	3

The horizontal bars represent the strings, of which there are 4. From the 4th string (uppermost on the ukulele) to to the 1st string it's...

G C E A

The black numbers on the strings represent the fret numbers. '0' means the string is open (unfretted).

The red letters are the actual notes you are playing - a diatonic scale begins and ends with the root: in this case **C**. It has a total of 5 whole steps: in this scale it's...

C>D, D>E, F>G, G>A and A>B

...and 2 half steps: in this scale it's...

E>F and B>C

So the notes and half notes, in order, are...

1 1 ½ 1 1 1 ½

The blue numbers are the ideal fingers to use...

- 1 - index or first finger
 - 2 - second finger
 - 3 - ring or third finger
 - 4 - small or fourth finger
- 0 - an open string with no fretting.
