

Diatonic scale of G (Ukulele)

A	-----	1st
E	-----1->2---	2nd
C	-----0->2->4->---	3rd
G	---0->2->4->-----	4th

Note	G	A	B	C	D	E	F#	G
Finger	0	2	4	0	2	4	1	2

The horizontal bars represent the strings, of which there are 4. From the 4th string (uppermost on the ukulele) to to the 1st string it's...

G C E A

The black numbers on the strings represent the fret numbers. '0' means the string is open (unfretted).

The red letters are the actual notes you are playing - a diatonic scale begins and ends with the root: in this case **G**. It has a total of 5 whole steps: in this scale it's...

G>A, A>B, C>D, D>E and E>F#

...and 2 half steps: in this scale it's...

B>C and F#>G

So the notes and half notes, in order, are...

1 1 1/2 1 1 1 1/2

The blue numbers are the ideal fingers to use...

- 1 - index or first finger
- 2 - second finger
- 3 - ring or third finger
- 4 - small or fourth finger

0 - an open string with no fretting.

The tab given above assumes low G tuning.
