## What it all means

Written by Hank Williams, the song is a mixture of English and Cajun French. It tells the story of Joe who is about to leave home with his girlfriend to set up home nearby.

<b>pirogue</b>	a flat-bottom boat
<b>pole the pirogue</b>	use a punt-like pole to propel the boat (May also be a metaphor for setting off on a journey of life.)
<b>Yvonne</b>	Joe's fiancé
<b>bayou</b>	a shallow stretch of water
<b>Jambalaya</b>	a traditional Creole dish of rice, vegetables and meat
<b>Crawfish pie</b>	popular in Creole and Cajun cuisine
<b>Gumbo</b>	a thick soup made from smoked sausage, chicken and ham. Popular in Louisiana
<b>ma cher amio</b>	Cajun French for my best friend
<b>fruit jar</b>	alcoholic drink
<b>Thibodaux, Fountainaux</b>	Joe and Yvonne's extended families
<b>mon</b>	Joe's possessions (which he'll swap to buy Yvonne what she needs)
