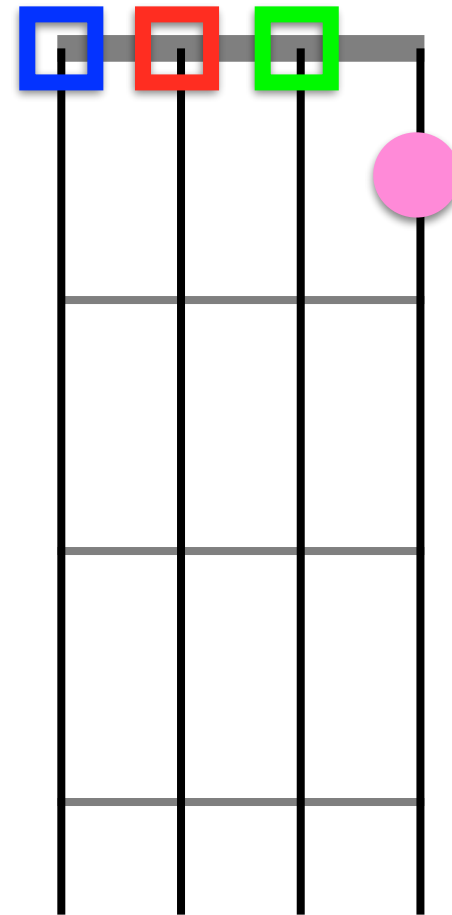


Seventh Chords

Seventh chords are known as extended chords as they usually contain four notes. They have a **Root**, a **Major 3rd** which is four semitones above the root, a **5th** (also known as a **Perfect 5th**) which is five full notes or seven semitones above the **Root** and an added **7th** which is three semitones above the **5th**.

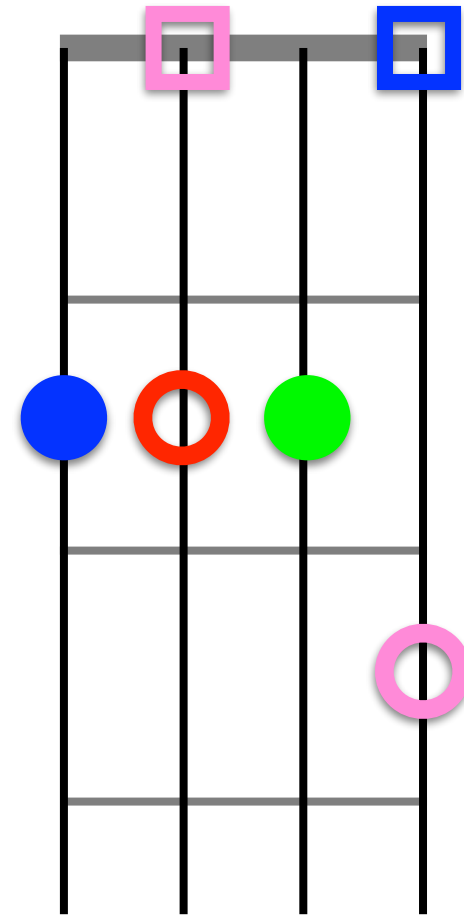
