
## Seventh Chords

Seventh chords are known as extended chords as they usually contain four notes. They have a Root, a Major 3rd which is four semitones above the root, a 5th (also known as a Perfect 5th) which is five full notes or seven semitones above the Root and an added 7th which is three semitones above the 5th.












Root: C Major 3rd: E 5th: G 7th: Bb




Root: D Major 3rd: F# 5th: A 7th: C

Root: Eb Major 3rd: G 5th: Bb 7th: Db




Root: E Major 3rd: G# 5th: B 7th: D






